Time	Activity	Outcome	Notes
10 mins	Welcome, safety information and instructions.	Ensure the safety and well-being of staff and pupils during their visit.	Any child not responding to safety instruction will, at the Museum Education Officer's request, be escorted to the Museum to await their group.
60 mins	Tour of Lymington. 5-6 stops will be made in safe locations to point out local features and relate elements of the history of the town including its ancient past, its smuggling history and its importance as a market town. For example Railway Station, Museum/National School, High Street etc.	Pupils will learn memorable facts about Lymington's past related to features.	Pictures may be shown to illustrate change over time. A short break can be added to eat fruit, have drinks. Hot drinks for staff can be made available on request in advance.
20 mins	Time in the Museum with a trail if requested, to reinforce learning and to add new information, especially about salt-making, boat-building and smuggling.	Pupils will use the many hands-on experiences in the galleries to reinforce and add to their learning.	Please request a trail in advance. Paper and clipboards can be made available for sketching or note-taking.
